Increasing safety and securing a sustainable industry: do we have the right focus today?

Wind farms and drone operations; new possibilities.

We are very much looking forward to seeing you for another three exciting conference days at Sola.

Stiftelsen Solakonferansen (The Sola Conference Foundation) are embracing the whole aviation industry during the annual Solakonferansen (The Sola Conference). The objective of the conference is to gather representation from all levels within the authorities, oil companies, helicopter manufacturers, helicopter operators etc. to discuss the industry and enhance aviation safety standards.

As for the previous four conferences, this year will also focus on offshore helicopter operations. The conference will be held in the English language.

In our previous conferences we have been looking towards the future, both short and long term, to give a picture of what lies ahead for the industry, of course with an explicit focus on offshore helicopter safety. After the downturn in the oil industry we now see challenges for the industry that must be taken seriously. The question we ask this year is *do we have the correct focus today*, given what we observe in the industry? We also see new challenges and opportunities in areas like drone operations and wind farms far from shore. These are the areas we will discuss during this year's conference. All with safety as the main headline.

There are many interesting aspects around these topics. Of course, safety is the main driver for this conference, so all presentations revolve around this topic, coming from different perspectives, of course. The first afternoon of the conference, we set the scene with the manufacturers bringing us up to speed on news and updates on their side. On the second day we have a wide variety of topics covering the headline of the conference. Day three is the "traditional" day with updates from The Ministry of Transport and Communications, the CAA NO etc. On both evenings we set the scene for mingling and networking with the first evening on the top floor of the conference hotel, and the second evening on a selected remote location.

Of course, we want Solakonferansen to be a common arena for the industry, so we have also made it possible for participants/groups of participants or companies who wish to conduct internal meetings at the conference hotel, such as before the official opening and lunch the first day, and after lunch last day. We can offer meeting room with capacity from 5 to 20 people. Furthermore, we have a larger meeting room that seats up to 70 participants. This room can optionally be offered as a show room. First come – first serve, no charge.
